

John 1. 1-18

The story of the birth of Jesus at Bethlehem is so well known, so often told, sung, acted, depicted, that it may seem to become a routine part of the Christmas holiday, a passing reminder of what the season is about. A birth is easy to understand, easy to depict imaginatively without knowledge of the details. But how can we depict the heart of the mystery?

No picture, no narrative, can make the coming of God into the world of human beings a part of our annual pageant. Only the inspired words of the Evangelist can tell of the eternal God, perfect in power and majesty, entering into human life with all its limitations. We have seen his glory.

But who saw it — only the few who were privileged to be of his human family, to be his close friends, to hear him preach, to be the enemies who planned his death? Not for thirty years, but for all time, those who would receive him could share in the divine light, see with the inner eye of faith the glory that had come into the world. It could be seen in a precious relationship, a father and his son in all the suffering and the joy.

The mutual love gives its blessing to the happy families of this day, heals the wounds of past estrangement, and draws us into one as children of the eternal Father.

Christmas Customs

Christmas is one of the times of year when customs and traditions come to the foremost of our minds. It can be the little things, 'lunch always begins at three' to the bigger things, 'we always have an oversized Turkey at Christmas'.

From the tree to the presents all of these are traditions we love and are attached to, and every family has its own things. There should, however, be customs that we keep in the home that point to the true importance of this festival. It is almost certain that you are doing the most important one as you are in Church worshipping the infant Christ at the crib and receiving him in the Eucharist. But there can be as is more.

Will you say grace before sitting down for lunch, after all should we not give thanks for all that God has given us.

Do you have a crib in your house? It need not look like, nor be as big and exotic as the Church one, but a crib at the centre of each household provides a place to pray before and talk with children about the truths of Christmas.

There is another wonderful custom of a placing a candle burning in the front window of your house so that the Holy Family know that there is a place with room for them in it.

Whatever you do, make sure that there is room for God this Christmas day.

Among the many patristic hymns translated by one of the great Fathers of the catholic revival in the Church of

England, John Mason Neale, one of my favourites is that originally written by the early eighth-century Patriarch of Constantinople, St Germanus. It begins, in Neale's version,

A Great and mighty wonder, A full and holy cure!


and is usually set to the lovely Christmas carol melody, *Es ist ein Ros entsprungen* ('A Spotless Rose'.) Sadly, I suspect is it seldom sung nowadays, not having the familiar appeal of *O Come All Ye Faithful* or *Hark! The herald angels sing!* This is a pity, as, like all the best hymns, it contains some substantial theology. In the second verse, we read:


The Word becomes incarnate And yet remains on high

This couplet reminds us that, in the Incarnation, it is truly the Son of God in the fullness of his divinity (one in being with the Father) who unites Himself with human nature, and comes to exist as man. This is the whole point of the Christmas mystery, the mystery of the Word made Flesh. It is not a weakened, an "emptied out" form of the Son of God who becomes man: it is God, Christ and Son and Lord. It is not that Christ's humanity somehow brings God down to our level, that could never be: rather, it is Christ's divinity which divinises our humanity.

so that we are raised up to God. Christmas – as Pope St Leo the Great taught long ago – teaches us about the nobility and dignity of man.

So much of contemporary society seeks to conform us to a diminished and cramped understanding of what it means to be human: that we are defined by what we buy, what we accumulate, what power we can exercise, even how youthful we look. Thank goodness that the Christian vision of the human person is so much richer. That is what we celebrate each and every Christmas Day.
